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


School Meals

School dinner money is currently £2.00 per week, or £58.00 for next term. Please ensure that diners are paid-for **in advance**. Cheques should be made payable to **Derbyshire County**

Council please. **Free School Meals:** Forms are available from the office, if you think you may be eligible for this. We urge KS1 parents to complete a form of eligibility, even though infant meals are currently free of charge. This will enable school to receive additional funding to provide extra support for your child. We can advise whether you are likely to be eligible—just ask.

Morning Club

We are again running morning club on Mondays and Tuesdays, for anyone who would like to drop their child off at school early. There is a charge of £5 from 8am, or £3.50 from 8:30am, payable on the day. The gate is opened at 8:50am, and parents are responsible for pupils until 9am when the school day begins.

Please note: There will be no morning club during the first week back to school

Uniform

Please ensure that **ALL** your child's clothing is labelled clearly with their name—this is especially important as children are now going swimming, where they get completely changed. It is impossible to pair-up unnamed items with their rightful owners, when clothing, shoes and equipment do not have names in.

Please also ensure that your child has full uniform—including proper PE kit. This consists of a standard short-sleeved t-shirt, shorts, joggers and a warm, long-sleeved sweatshirt/jumper for outdoor sport. Children are not allowed to do PE in tights—so socks must be provided. Proper PE plimsolls/trainers must also be worn—fancy, fashion pumps are not suitable.

COOL MILK



Headlice

Please continue to check your child's hair every

day for signs of headlice.

Combing through with conditioner and a very fine toothed comb, is the best way to remove the eggs ('nits') . Treatments are also available from the pharmacy/supermarket, which will treat headlice quickly and easily. Unfortunately, this is a very common problem in schools, and your vigilance is requested, to help us deal with this issue. Even if you have treated your child's hair, you should still check daily, in case they have returned.
